A Word about Communion -

Trinity has an “Open Table.” All who love Jesus are welcome to share in this Holy Feast. We acknowledge that Jesus is the host and all are guests. We use the symbols of bread and a taste of the vine to remind us of Jesus’ last supper with his followers, and of God’s enduring love.

When we celebrate Communion, we do so as the central act of our worship. We do not rush. Each person is afforded the time to rest in the experience of the Sacrament and to receive a blessing.

Our ushers will guide you as to when it is best to move forward so as to avoid a feeling of being hurried and the disruption of a long line.

Music is offered to assist your meditations and prayers as you await guidance from an usher or spend time in God’s presence after having received Communion.

If an usher guides you to the front from the left side of the sanctuary, you will pass from left to right, receiving the bread, the cup and a blessing. After depositing your empty cup with an usher, you will return to your pew using the

aisle on the right hand side of the sanctuary. The direction of flow is reversed for those receiving from the right.

There may be some who chose not to receive communion but would like to come forward for a blessing. This is welcome. In some traditions, the person who prefers to abstain from Communion while receiving a blessing, indicates this by holding their hands together upon their chest. Whatever sign or indication you choose, we will honour your wish and offer a blessing.
