

This week's Phone Tree Message - 24 June 2020

I am the Chaplain to the Smiths Falls Police Service and because of COVID-19 limitations, I have not been able to visit for months. I want our Folk at SFPS to know that they are supported in prayer.

There has been much in the news these several weeks that touches Police Services. From the tragic events in Portapique, Nova Scotia, to recent conversations regarding Defunding; it seems that Police Services everywhere have been in some way under scrutiny.

We are served by very good Folk in Smiths Falls and I ask you to remember them, with me, in your prayers.

The "Reopening Trinity Committee" has been formed and their work is beginning. And it will be a lot of work. There is much to consider. We hope to ensure that all requirements to safely reopen our Church, *no earlier than Labour Day Weekend,* are in place and approved by competent authorities as per EOORC Guidance, "Safely Reopening our Churches."

Our guiding principle will be exclusively your health and safety.

The congregation will be apprised of developments.

Stay safe and encourage the people you love to remain so.

Learning with Children

When Adrienne was a girl, she was a Cub. Lorraine and I were Cub leaders. One of the big things that Cubs look forward to is the Cub Car Rally. Adrienne and I built a Cub Car together.

A Cub Car is made out of a block of wood and is powered by a CO2 cartridge. There are two prize categories - fastest and the best designed. Adreinne and I chose to work toward the best design. We figured that most of the other Cubs would be going for speed, so we chose the category in which we felt we could reasonably compete and have a chance to win.

We also surmised that in the design category that the advantage would go to creativity and a departure from the norm. We made a Pop-Top Westfalia Camper Van Cub Car. It had a working Pop-Top and everything. We did not win but that was because the judges were confused.

The day seemed to show that many of the Cubs had the same kind of father, mother or adult friend that Adrienne had. The quality and design of many of the cars were of a level that suggested that somebody had their project taken over. Maybe 4-H has the same kind of help from parents. In any case, it looked like for some, the competition was between fathers... not between Cubs.

What is the best way to help?

Listen.

Maybe ask if help is wanted.

Listen.

Provide resources or tools.

Listen.

Support.

Today's Bible story is about helping. Jesus uses the example of helping a Prophet and a Righteous person. A Prophet speaks. A righteous person acts. A prophet knows what to say and a Righteous person knows what to do. So you do not have to help them with that. Jesus says, welcome them. He also talks about giving a cup of cold water.

Jesus does not tell us to help by taking over.

Reflection -

The past number of weeks have been packed with the kind of news and occasions that inspire well meaning people to help. With COVID-19 the ways that some would normally like to be involved are not available. Perhaps, then, it is a good time to think, without letting "doing' get in the way.

June is Pride month, last Sunday was National Indigenous Peoples Day, yesterday, June 27 was Canadian Multiculturalism Day. These are the kinds of commemorations in which many in our congregation would like to support or participate. These are the kinds of commemorations and activities that inspire many to consider what it means to be an Ally; to be part of a movement with which you are sympathetic without necessarily being an identified member of the group that is being celebrated or recognized or supported.

If we wish to be involved in another's quest for justice, inclusion or equity and have not experienced the challenge ourselves or are in an advantaged position, how do we assist with integrity? How are we actually helpful?

50 years ago, my father was posted to an Air Base in Greenwood, Nova Scotia. We moved into Military housing. While unpacking and setting up, a neighbour came over to welcome us and to visit my mother. The neighbour wanted to be helpful. My mother was busy, as one would be when one is unpacking, putting things away and managing four children.

The new neighbour, as it turned out, was something of a whirlwind. She came in, told my mother the lay of the land and adjusted the thermostat. With the adjustment came something of an explanation as to how thermostats worked. My mother is and always has been a dear sweet and proud woman. Mom likes a cool house and knows how to work a thermostat. The house was too cool for her new friend's liking, so her new friend fixed it right away and offered helpful instruction. My mother noticed that. I know she noticed that because I heard her speaking about it. Our new neighbour's welcome was welcome, her help was less so. It's not that my mother does not accept assistance. It is nice to be asked, though. It is also nice not to have somebody come into your house and take over. Even if they are well intentioned.

A prophet speaks the word of God.

A righteous person does the will of God.

A prophet knows what to say. A righteous person knows what to do.

Both a prophet and a righteous person are engaged in the kind of activity to which people who want to be or do good are attracted and in which they would like to participate. Good people want to help godly proclamations and works of righteousness, even when or perhaps sometimes *especially* when they are not prophets or overwhelmingly righteous themselves. There is a reward in helpful participation. It feels good. However, a prophet knows what to say and a righteous person knows what to do. In the context of Jesus' day and culture, they are called out, equipped and identified as a prophet or worker in righteousness. A welcome would be helpful,... perhaps a cup of cold water. How to be a prophet, how to do works of righteousness,... well, they have that in hand.

My mother had setting up her own home well in hand ... including the temperature. A welcome was welcome but there was no need to take over... Thank-You very much.

Trinity is an Affirming Congregation. Trinity recognizes our opportunity and responsibility with respect to our Indeginious neighbours as outlined by the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada. Trinity supports Diversity. In the month of June, some of us may be considering how to appropriately be involved in the work that the days and weeks of recognition within this month imply; what it means to be an ally.

- 1. Be willing to listen and learn. Trust the experiences of those you want to support.
- 2. Help open up spaces without taking them over. Make your resources available.
- 3. Research. Do not place the expectation of teaching on the community you want to support. They are busy enough. Teach yourself and relieve the people you want to support of that burden.

- 4. Resist the desire to be a "savior." This is a manifestation of the very inequity to which you claim to be opposed.
- 5. Start in your own circle. Promote equality and justice in your own community.

Trinity hosts Rainbow sabbath and supports Pride. We do not organize the parade. We do as we are asked. It is not our Parade. We do not help by telling people what to do. Organizing the potluck has been given to us but we do not assume year by year that we will be asked again. We are not intrusive or insistent.

We are honoured to have a space in which the Lanark Drum Circle can meet. We are working to make the space inviting and comfortable. We ask before we do anything.

We are honoured to welcome Chinese New Year. The work belongs to the Chinese Community and many of us are present as guests.

Being an Ally is about service, it is not about taking over or knowing better. *We may assist but we never insist.*

This way of being ensures that progress and dignity belongs to those who have had a lived experience of being treated as outsiders and that the joy and the pride and the accomplishment belongs to those who were once denied it. We do not restore dignity by taking over. We can never make another person's victory a part of our resume. We do, however, have a heartfelt "welcome" and a deep, cool well of living water.
