



You show us our hearts,





After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." Reflection - We Widen Our Circle

As part of our journey in becoming an Affirming Congregation, Trinity has embarked on a series of activities to reconcile this possibility with our feelings and faith and to illuminate the question with the light of Scripture. We have considered how our exploration is consistent with our ancient Scripture and Traditions of the Church.

We follow the Revised Common Lectionary every Sunday, a three-year cycle of weekly Scripture Readings used by the majority of mainline Protestant churches. Not once have we changed the readings to fit the theme of Affirm. We did not resort to proof texting in order to twist the Word of God to our favour. We have been faithful and what we found by doing so was remarkable and Affirming. This includes the readings for today. Today's lesson was not selected or altered as the perfect text to illuminate our Celebration. Just like all our other Services and suggested Scripture for the day, the Gospel Lesson fits perfectly and comfortably in providing a lesson of inclusion and adaptation.

When Jesus addresses his Disciples this morning he begins with, "Peace be with you." His words are immediately followed by that which brings peace -

Jesus says "Peace be with you" and offers Reassurance.

Jesus says "Peace be with you" and offers Purpose and Power to Change.

Jesus says "Peace be with you" and demonstrates Active Awareness and Inclusion.

"Peace be with you." What is required for the Peace Christ offers?

Reassurance - "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord.

The world in which the Disciples lived had fundamentally changed. Jesus was betrayed, beaten and crucified. The Disciples knew him to be dead. Their every hope was taken away. There could be no Peace as they

understood it without Jesus. Having Jesus with them was the first and most important criteria for Peace. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord.

Trinity is a Christian Church. Of first importance is our belief that Jesus is alive and with us. This, we believe, in this we rejoice. In this we find peace. In this, we celebrate just like that first band of Disciples huddled together in the Upper Room.

"Peace be with you." What is required for the Peace Christ offers?

Purpose and Power to Change - "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

The world in which the Disciples lived would continue to change. The setting of the Gospel was much the same as before the crucifixion but the Disciples were only a generation away from the destruction of Jerusalem. Judea would be dispersed into the diaspora. The Priests, Pharisees and Temple would soon disappear. Jesus would remain with them through the agency of the Spirit. The world in which they lived while meeting Jesus in the Upper Room would soon come to an end.

When everything changes, there is no peace without Purpose and Power to adapt. We read of Sin and Forgiveness. These words carry one meaning in a religious context but they carry a different sense in the context of change. The word translated "forgive" means to permit to give space to. The word translated "Sin" is used in other ancient Greek writings in as an Archer hitting a target. "Sin" means to miss the mark. Jesus is saying, "You have the power, to permit a new mark in the new world."

The early Church exercised this power often and generously as the

followers of Christ grew in relevance and relationship with the Greek Culture in which she found herself. Food Laws, Circumcision, ceremonial preparation, the role of women all changed... and changed quickly.

Every age is a change from the past. The church remains faithful to Jesus but reaches out to fulfill its purpose in a relevant way by exercising her power and authority to change. We celebrate our becoming an Affirming Congregation because we take the requirement and power to adapt seriously. Jesus and later the Apostle Paul, demonstrated this constantly. Exercising this power and responsibility is the reason we exist today.

If you consider the image of an archer, we change our aim because the target changes. Today, we understand those who fall under what may be described as LGBTQ+ differently than we did in the past. To maintain an old way of responding in light of a new understanding makes us irrelevant, there is no peace in this. It is contrary to our purpose and ignores the Permission and Power of the Holy Spirit.

"Peace be with you." What is required for the Peace Christ offers?

Active Awareness and Inclusion - Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe."

Thomas has been poorly remembered. We have all heard or used the expression, "Doubting Thomas." This arose from the fact that Thomas doubted the other disciples when they reported that they had seen Jesus alive. However, Thomas was not like the others. Where they might conclude that Jesus was alive because they had seen him, Thomas had good reason not to come to the same conclusion.

Thomas knew the other disciples. He had seen them make bold

pronouncements, only to be proven wrong. More importantly, Thomas had a nickname. We remember "Doubting Thomas," however, the nickname assigned by his peers was "the Twin." For the other disciples seeing Jesus after the crucifiction meant Jesus was alive. Thomas was a twin. There was another human being walking the earth that looked just like him. While others might say, "Jesus is Alive!" Thomas, had good reason to think, "Jesus was a twin." Twins are distinguished by scars, tattoos and distinguishing marks, thus Thomas had to see not only a man who looked like Jesus but who carried the same scars.

Thomas was not a mere doubter; Thomas was a twin. Thomas sought the evidence a twin would require. Given his experience and context, Thomas made a totally legitimate request. **To miss this point is to miss the point all together. Thomas was not a doubter, he was born a Twin.**Jesus did not miss this point. Jesus made sure Thomas was included in a way that was specific to his needs, even though they were different than the other ten surviving Disciples. Just like Lady Gaga, Thomas could say, "Baby I was Born this Way."

We have assigned a sin to Thomas for 2000 years without cause. For centuries, we have believed that sexual orientation and gender identity was the expression of a poor moral choice. In our age, we have learned and come to know that these are not choices but ways of being into which we are born. If this is the case, they cannot be regarded as missing the mark. If this is the case, we must adjust the target and make our circle wider.

This we do, this we have done, this we celebrate. This is in obedience to Jesus and consistent with the Purpose and Power of the Spirit he breathed upon the first Disciples in that Upper Room. This is consistent with the Purpose and Power of the Spirit he breathed upon us in this place, in this age.

## **Invitation to Offering**






