While we were separated from each other, we were never separated from the Love of God. We open the sanctuary for Sunday Worship on 13 September. While there will be limitations and many folk will remain at home for safety reasons, we are living in hope.

## Learning with Children

I do not put puzzles together often although I love them. I love problem solving. The bigger the problem, the better I like it. Sometimes when I tell a story, I will say that I did something against the advice of other people. Lorraine says that is because I'm a contrarian. I think I like it because people telling me that something is too hard to do or something will not work is like a dare. When I am on a problem, I can spend a lot of time on it. Some people think I am patient. I am not sure if I am patient but I am determined... especially, if something is supposed to be hard. If you think something cannot be done... well dare me and let's try.

I have a problem though. I can be quite impatient with easy problems or with problems that should be easy. I hate not being able to do something that is supposed to be easy. I really have to watch what I say and how I act... Sometimes on a customer service chat or phone call, I have to start with, "I know, I am sure you are a wonderful person and my problem is not your fault... but I am quite frustrated with trying to make an easy thing work." If I buy a box of something and the label says, "This is hard to do," well that sounds like fun all day. If I buy something and it says, "Just plug it in and go," well, ... I become quite unhappy to spend even a few minutes to figure it out. Things that are easy should be easy. I do not like it when something that should be easy is hard...

The Bible reading today tells us how to sort out disagreements with our friends in the church. It is a bit of a process with no guarantee of success. You would think that it should be easy to sort out problems with people with whom you agree mostly... It should be like "Plug and Play." We seem able to do handstands to welcome strangers and sometimes cannot be reconciled with friends... I wonder if part of that is because we have an instinct to be impatient in relationships where we expect things to be easy... because of our impatience, we make an easy thing hard... and that just annoys us.

Maybe when we are in that situation sometimes we should remember, step back and say, "You know, this should be easy. I can make it easy by just letting it go..." Especially when the relationship or person is worth

more than thinking we are right on some issue that is not as important as the relationship itself...

### **Reflection - Grudge or a Gift**

Lending money to a friend or relative is one of the hardest easy things to do. When a friend or relative asks to borrow money, it may be hard because the person is embarrassed. However, it is easier than going to the bank, ... otherwise your friend or relative would be signing papers instead of talking to you.

What makes borrowing from a friend or relative easy?

Very often, the loan is open-ended... The terms of repayment are looser than a bank's ... It is awkward and cumbersome to write down terms of repayment or deal with interest. Again, if they are coming to you, it is because you're easier; fewer details, if any at all

However, that ease sometimes leads to complications ... the sense of urgency in repaying the loan is reduced. It is common that the rest of life, other obligations and emergencies take precedence and repayment is pushed back... after all, you are a friend or a relative, ... you understand and are forgiving ... You are not threatening or intimidating.

Of course, because you are a friend or a relative ... Well, you do not want to be pushy in asking... it is awkward ... you do not want to put stress on the relationship... Ironically, this may be stressful ...

Awkward goes both ways ... the one who borrows may feel indebted to the one who loaned ... the dynamics of the relationship shifts ... An

inequality is introduced. If the borrower feels awkward, he or she may assume that you feel awkward or even dismayed ... their interactions may begin to reflect that ... so the borrower becomes elusive or defensive ....

Oh, yes ... It is quite possible that the circumstance that caused the borrower to approach you has not changed, ... he or she may ask again ... without having repaid the original loan ... As Alice in Wonderland would say, "The situation becomes curiouser and curiouser."

An easy solution, borrow from a friend or relative when a bank is complicated ... carries a good possibility of its own complications ... Something that is thought to be easy becomes hard precisely *because it was supposed to be easy* ... complications introduced to a situation that was supposed to be easy can cause the whole relationship to go sideways ... nobody likes that...

Although the best advice is "Do not give advice." In these circumstances, I give advice. Do not lend money to a relative or a friend ... make it a gift outright and forget about it. If you cannot give it away, do not loan it... If you expect loaning money to a friend or a relative is easy ... you have a good chance to discover it is hard after all, this is disappointing and not worth it ... make it a gift... period. Easy things that become hard are very frustrating. Nobody wants this to compromise a good relationship.

I expect that it is a universal hope and expectation that relationships between Jesus Disciples ancient and modern, should be harmonious. After all, Jesus preached love and peace and reconciliation, *we* preach love and peace and reconciliation. While we are telling other people how to get along, it is a reasonable expectation that we should get along as well. One would think that it is easy for us. Not only that, we are mostly all rather alike. We mostly pretty much agree on important issues. The truth is that small differences can divide.

The fact that differences are small and should be easy to resolve makes them more difficult to tolerate. "Parkinson's law of triviality" is an argument that members of an organization give disproportionate weight to trivial issues. They do so because the smaller matter is expected to be

easily understood, so we gravitate toward it and get stuck. We expect hard problems or large differences to be difficult, so we face them as a challenge, not as a failure.

Today's Gospel lesson reminds us how that which is supposed to be easy, can escalate into something difficult.

*“If another member of the church sins against you, go and point out the fault when the two of you are alone. If the member listens to you, you have regained that one. But if you are not listened to, take one or two others along with you, so that every word may be confirmed by the evidence of two or three witnesses. If the member refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and if the offender refuses to listen even to the church, let such a one be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector.*

It is quite interesting that Jesus turns from this to -

*Truly I tell you, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven.*

The process ends with a decision - bind it or loose it. The decision to bind may be made at the end of the process. The decision to let it go can be made at any time.

It sounds almost like how the complexity or heartache that may arise from a simple circumstance like lending money to a friend or relative can be sealed by hanging on to it, bearing a grudge if payment is not made; or can be resolved by letting it go... declaring the loan a gift. Declaring the loan a gift can be made right at the beginning.

Why am I preaching this today? Is there some conflict in the church that we should ferret out? Is there news of disagreement? No. Trinity gets along remarkably well. This just happens to be the Gospel for today. However, the irritation and complexity of easy problems becoming disproportionately frustrating is not limited to the church. We also live in families, we have brothers and sisters, partners and friends. We are members of Lodges, service clubs, we volunteer in other organizations. We have political opinions. We bump into little problems and differences that promise to be easy and threaten to go sideways all the time.

How often do you hear yourself say, “*This is not supposed to be hard?*” In those moments, you can let it escalate, or you can let it stay small... Will this turn into a Grudge or a Gift? *Truly I tell you, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven.* “Heaven” implies a long time ... We can take a little problem and let it grow into something we are stuck with for a long time; or we can let it go.

May God cause us to be wise in moments and circumstances that are supposed to be easy and let them remain so.
