Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ has been born of God, and everyone who loves the parent loves the child. By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God and obey his commandments. For the love of God is this, that we obey his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome, for whatever is born of God conquers the world. And this is the victory that conquers the world, our faith. Who is it that conquers the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?

This is the one who came by water and blood, Jesus Christ, not with the water only but with the water and the blood. And the Spirit is the one that testifies, for the Spirit is the truth.

John 15: 9-17

As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete.

I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.

Reflection

The Gospel Lesson this morning is wonderful. It essentially lays out or summarizes much of what was in the children’s time. There is Life, there is love, there are commands or lessons. Added to this is sacrifice - *No one has greater love than this, to lay down one’s life for one’s friends.*

Just as in the time with Children, one does not have to look long or hard to see how the life and the love of Jesus parallels the life and love that resides in the ideal of “Mother.”

Briefly this morning, I would like to reflect on three grand beliefs of traditional Christianity that find a parallel in the ideal of “Motherhood.”

- 1 - The ideal of Laying down your life for others -
- 2 - The ideal of bearing another’s burden -
- 3 - The ideal of equipping, of letting go, of setting free

Christianity that find a parallel in the ideal of “Motherhood” in - The ideal of Laying down your life for others -

Motherhood is costly. Raising children is expensive in countless ways. Groceries, clothing, piano lessons, tuition ... are just a few of

monetary costs. If you go out, you can add the cost of a babysitter. If you work outside of the home, you can add the cost of Daycare. This is just money. Continuing education and advancement at work are challenging. Mothers juggling multiple responsibilities. Those who do not have children in general have more time, more money, more opportunity, more promotions.

Full and complete, uninterrupted adult conversations are very often sacrificed. If you have young children at home, frequent Friday Date Nights with your friends become rare, even endangered. Road trips are punctuated more frequently with rest stops. With almost constant, sometimes conflicting demands, it might seem that you, your needs, your essence are lost in the deluge. A mother's life is laid down for those she loves, no doubt.

That said, there is satisfaction and reward in laying down your life for friends and family. Receiving love in return is a beautiful reward. It is true that if you are a mother that receives a coffee filter flower and hand made card today there is a reward in that. The love of a child is a precious gift.

But a mother does not just sacrifice for her grateful children. She lays down her life for everybody, everywhere... grateful or not. Like Jesus, Mothers lay down their life for people who simply do not appreciate it or care in the least.

I was reading a critique of the recent Federal Budget and the proposal for Universal Childcare. In the comments, I read this - *"My wife and I support no children so pray tell me why either she or I should be forced through taxation to pay for your kids to go to daycare?"* I find that such comments are highly disrespectful. And selfish. Mothers of today are raising the taxpayers and caregivers of the future. Investing in children and mothers today means that there will be a social underpinning to support us in the future. Even those who have no children of their own. This is worth much more than \$10.00 a day.

Mothers lay down their lives for others, their children, their community, those who appreciate it and those who do not.

Christianity finds a parallel in the ideal of “Motherhood” in - The ideal of bearing another’s burden -

Traditional Christianity carries a vision of Jesus taking on the sins of the world. The ideal of Motherhood includes bearing the burden of her children. I still keep my mother up at night. My mother has a whole list of her own concerns that she denies or ignores while she worries about her adult children who, I would suggest, are much less burdened than she is herself. She remains generous with her children even though each of us are materially better off than she. The ideal of a mother includes bearing the burdens of her children, their worries or concerns,... even when they are seemingly smaller than her own.

In addition bearing the worries and concerns of her children on her own or by her own volition or from within ... some folk are quite content to thrust the struggles or failures of the child on the mother. As if selfish comments in the news were not sufficiently uncharitable and uninformed, Facebook is filled with cringe-worthy comments and memes. Almost everyday there is some meme that outlines the good old days of responsible parenting that included a switch, a slap, a sternness, an unquestioned respect for any authority ... and cursive writing ... Where any of these are lacking and the child finds him or herself in trouble ... it is often the result of poor parenting, incompetent mothers ... or teachers. So the sins of the child are born by the mother, just as in traditional Christianity the sins of humanity are nailed to the cross.

We are in the season of Easter. Soon it will be Pentecost. Jesus walked among his disciples for three years. He equipped the church at

Pentecost and then gave us the keys to the Kingdom. If you consider the prayer in John 17, this was quite difficult. It was also quite necessary.

My own dear mother, who still worries and stays awake from time to time thinking of her children ... gifted me with my first set of luggage. School's out time to go. Part of a mother's success is measured in an empty nest. How hard it must be. Your baby or babies are ready to take on the world. Letting go might be one of the harder obligations of Motherhood.

We have a number of young mothers in our congregation. We also have a little cadre of children who, we hope, will have made cards and flowers for this morning. We also hope that 20 - 25 years from now when our time is approaching its end, today's children will have received all the Life, Love and Lessons required to be caring members of the community which will be theirs to build. We hope that the children of our congregation and time will remember us kindly. Much may depend upon how we love and respect our mothers and motherhood today.
