Genesis 18:1-10a

The Lord appeared to Abraham by the oaks of Mamre, as he sat at the entrance of his tent in the heat of the day. He looked up and saw three men standing near him. When he saw them, he ran from the tent entrance to meet them and bowed down to the ground. He said, “My lord, if I find favor with you, do not pass by your servant. Let a little water be brought, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the tree. Let me bring a little bread, that you may refresh yourselves, and after that you may pass on—since you have come to your servant.” So they said, “Do as you have said.” And Abraham hastened into the tent to Sarah and said, “Make ready quickly three measures of choice flour, knead it, and make cakes.” Abraham ran to the herd and took a calf, tender and good, and gave it to the servant, who hastened to prepare it. Reflection

I love to cook and I like to be prepared. I tend to be a little focused, too. At the last mega sale, I purchased three metal and one glass bowl. They were for placing chopped vegetables, spices and such in a lie in the order in which they are cooked. This way, I achieve exquisite timing.

I do not like confusion. I have to have a strategy to manage confusion, if I am expected to work in a confusing or emotionally charged environment.

This is the flow chart I used while the Brigade Chaplain in Petawawa.

Mary and Martha. Why is Martha distracted? She was the one who invited Jesus to her home? Why is she not ready? Mary is ready.

We are entering a planning phase in the autumn. We know that the world is changing and we know that we are not in the best shape we have ever been in, we also know that we are able to do something now. So it is incumbent upon us to be prepared so that when the day comes, we will be able to choose the better part that will not be taken away from us.

We cannot let the future just fall upon us.

Lorraine and I have hosted house concerts. To be sure, everything is set up before people come. We want to listen to the band. Why is Martha distracted by many things? Because she is unprepared.

Martha knew Jesus was coming. Why is she not ready?

Lorraine does not like to show up at people's homes exactly on time. She thinks it is rude. She assumes that the hosts will be consumed with

last minute details. I however, like to show up at exactly the prescribed time. I like to be ready at the exact prescribed time.

I have a friend who when he comes to visit will, without fail, ask, "Do we have to eat right away?" I say, yes. Lorraine will politely say no, of course not, I interject with yes. If you do not care if the food is over cooked or cold, then here, have a can of corned beef hash whenever you want. As for me, I am eating at five o'clock. I come in and say, steaks will be ready in 3 and ½ minutes. Lorraine will say you are making this stressful. I say, you are making it stressful by being unprepared.
