

Monday, September 19, 2022, will be a National Day of Mourning in Canada, to mark the passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. This coincides with Her Late Majesty's State Funeral in London, United Kingdom, and the end of the official period of mourning in Canada.

In view of the Queen's Funeral, Monday's routine at Trinity will be suspended in order to provide space and time in the Sanctuary / Chapel for folk who would like to watch a recording of the Queen's Funeral in a Church sanctuary setting with other members of the Congregation rather than watching it at home alone.

We will play the recording to correspond with the same sequence as London, England. Therefore, we will begin at 11:44 am (Our Time) to watch the procession from the Palace of Westminster to Westminster Abbey. The state funeral follows at 11:00. At around 11:55, the Last Post will sound, followed by a two-minute silence. Reveille, the national

anthem and a lament played by the Queen's piper will bring the state funeral service to an end at around 12:00.

It is our intent to begin in the Sanctuary / Chapel at 10:44 am (our time).

Luke 16:1-13

Then Jesus said to the disciples, “There was a rich man who had a manager, and charges were brought to him that this man was squandering his property. So he summoned him and said to him, ‘What is this that I hear about you? Give me an accounting of your management because you cannot be my manager any longer.’ Then the manager said to himself, ‘What will I do, now that my master is taking the position away from me? I am not strong enough to dig, and I am ashamed to beg. I have decided

what to do so that, when I am dismissed as manager, people may welcome me into their homes.’ So, summoning his master’s debtors one by one, he asked the first, ‘How much do you owe my master?’ He answered, ‘A hundred jugs of olive oil.’ He said to him, ‘Take your bill, sit down quickly, and make it fifty.’ Then he asked another, ‘And how much do you owe?’ He replied, ‘A hundred containers of wheat.’ He said to him, ‘Take your bill and make it eighty.’ And his master commended the dishonest manager because he had acted shrewdly, for the children of this age are more shrewd in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light. And I tell you, make friends for yourselves by means of dishonest wealth so that when it is gone they may welcome you into the eternal homes.

“Whoever is faithful in a very little is faithful also in much, and whoever is dishonest in a very little is dishonest also in much. If, then, you have not been faithful with the dishonest wealth, who will entrust to you the true riches? And if you have not been faithful with what belongs to another, who will give you what is your own? No slave can serve two masters, for a slave will either hate the one and love the other or be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and wealth.”
