O Holy God of wind and fire. Your Spirit renews the face of the earth and warms the hearts of your people. At Pentecost, we give thanks for the tongues that utter wise words and the flames that kindle renewed compassion. We are grateful for the fresh breezes that blow down the walls which separate us from you and from one another. And so it is that we join with every voice and tongue on earth and in the heavens to give you praise:

Holy, holy God, Power of life and love!

Let us remember your vision shown to us in Jesus at table. He shared food with followers and friends, with saints and sinners, with crowds of thousands on the hillside, and a few friends in an upper room. On the night before he died, he had supper with his companions. He took a loaf of bread, and after giving thanks, he broke it, and gave it to them saying: Take, eat. Do this in remembrance of me." Then he took a cup, and after giving thanks, he passed it among them saying: "Drink this. Do this in remembrance of me." Through this loaf and cup, Jesus lives within us. In word and deed, Jesus lives among us.

Remembering your boundless love for us in Jesus Christ, we offer you our praise, as we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Dying, Christ destroyed our death. Rising, Christ restored our life. Christ will come in glory.

We pray you, God of Love, send your Holy Spirit upon us and what we do here, that we, and these gifts, touched by your Spirit, may be signs of life and love to each other and to the whole world.

Praise be to God, the Source of love! Praise be to Christ, Love incarnate! Praise be to the Spirit, Love's power! Praise be to God!
